

Dear Graduate Students:

It's time to get excited! The 19th Annual Psychology Department Graduate Research Day (GRD) will take place on **Friday, April 28, 2023**. We expect to have an all-day and in-person event that allows graduate students to present their research. Psychology graduate students are invited to submit abstracts, from which oral and poster presentations will be selected. More details about the event schedule will be forthcoming.

Please submit your GRD research abstract soon! You can create a new abstract or you can re-use one from conferences you have attended and/or research you have published (but not yet presented at past Graduate Research Days).

The deadline for abstract submission is Monday March 13, 2023.

Please use the attached Submission Form, and indicate whether you would like your abstract to be considered for presentation as a 12-minute platform talk. A faculty committee will evaluate all submitted abstracts, and will select the **top ten** for oral presentation. Remaining abstracts will be assigned to poster sessions. Awards will be given for the best 12-min platform talk, and also for the best poster presentations within each of the five Psychology research areas (i.e., Clinical, Cognitive, Developmental, Neuroscience, and Social). These awards include both \$ and resumé-enhancing bragging rights.

General guidelines for preparing GRD presentations are provided below. Please note that if you are chosen to give a 12-min platform presentation, the GRD Committee will contact you to schedule a practice session about 1 week prior to the event. This is an excellent opportunity to hone your oral presentation skills in a supportive, constructive environment.

We welcome and appreciate your contribution to Graduate Research Day 2023. If you have any questions about the event or about your abstract submission, please contact one of the committee members. We look forward to hearing from you soon.

Guidelines for oral presentations:

Length: Platform presentations will be 12 minutes long, with an additional 3 minutes for questions. These will be presented during the GRD talk sessions.

Topic: You are expected to report data from one or more completed empirical studies. Each presentation should have a clear take-home message.

Audience: Unlike at scientific conferences, the GRD audience will include many non-experts in your area. Therefore, it is important that you frame your main research question in a broader context (much like you would do when you give a job talk), and avoid excessive jargon.

Practice session: You will have the opportunity to present your talk at a practice session, which will be attended by the GRD student and faculty committee members. At this point, you will receive feedback regarding your presentation. The practice session will be scheduled one to two weeks before Graduate Research Day, so that you have sufficient time to incorporate recommendations.

Guidelines for poster presentations:

You will prepare a poster for your presentation during poster sessions. More details about the poster format and size will be communicated soon.
